Pathways for year 6 students entering our year 7 and 8 programme next year

While all Year 7 and 8 programmes contain elements of Cambridge, we are keen to place students in pathways which best align with their current and future potential. In short, because the Cambridge Programme can be quite challenging, we want to get initial placements right (although changes down the track are sometimes made).

Accordingly, Year 7 intending students will undergo testing in weeks 3 and 4 of this term to assist us in determining their optimal Cambridge pathway. <u>If we have been advised that a year 6 student will not be with us in 2019</u>, they will not undergo this testing, unless a parent specifically advises us that they would like them to sit these assessments (by the end of next week please).

Mrs Donaldson will co-ordinate the placement process and, as part of this process, will also meet with previous teachers, and peruse the achievement (and other) data we have in our system. Parents are also invited to contribute to pathway decisions.

Careful placement will help ensure that our year 8 students are very well prepared for year 9 - and hopefully 12 months ahead of where they would be on entry to secondary school had they not done this programme. The pathways enable us to accommodate the aptitudes, interests, learning styles, extra-mural commitments etc of each child.

Just to recap, the primary pathways are as follows

- .. Full Cambridge Maths and English
- ... Full Cambridge Maths, hybrid English
- ... Full Cambridge English, hybrid Maths
- ... Hybrid Maths and English
- ... Alternatives matched to preferred intelligence / learning style

We will have three year 7 and 8 classes next year, and have not advertised places for out of zone students at this level to keep class numbers as low as possible.

Input to year 7 placement decisions

Pathway decisions will be made some time in the week beginning 12 November. Parents of year 6 students who would like to have input into these decisions are invited to make an appointment with Mrs Donaldson. We anticipate these discussions will take around 20 minutes per child. Proposed Changes to Year 7 and 8 Camps

Camps are only part of a good outdoor education programme, but they are an important part. Recent growth in our senior school means that we have too many students for one Auckland camp, and so we need to re-think provision in this area. From 2019, we are proposing that we "bookend" the senior school experience with an Auckland camp for year 7's in term 1, and a water based camp for year 8's (swimming, surfing, snorkelling, skiing etc) in term 4. The year 7 camp will be about a positive start to Cambridge, bonding and team building, and the year 8 camp would provide a time to come together, to reflect, to rebond, to celebrate, and to cement some enduring connections.

We do realise that if we implement this proposal in 2019, that current year 7's will have quite a period between their last and next camp and so, as a one off, we are planning an additional overnight experience in Term 1 for next year's year 8's (possibly paddle boarding at the Poor Knight Islands).

While we have run this proposal across a number of parents and have had a positive response, we are keen to provide an opportunity for other interested parents to meet with us to share their thoughts, and ask any questions. So, if you have children currently in, or soon to enter, our senior school, you are invited to

meet with Kevin and Katie in Kevin's office 3:15 pm Friday 26 October. We are excited to take our senior outdoor education programme to the next level, but we need the assurance that we have you on board as well. If the above time does not suit, Kevin and Katie are more than available by appointment, or on a drop by basis for a briefer chat.

Home Gardens

Welcome back to the new term. By now your seedlings should be well underway. Don't panic if you have had a few mishaps. As the weather warms up, the seeds will germinate much faster and you still have time to replant if need be.

A few tips for planting out...

Remember to 'harden' your seedlings off before planting out into the garden. This involves taking yours seedlings outside to a shelter spot during the day, then bringing them back inside at night. Gradually build up so that they are then out at night. This process should take approximately a week.

When transplanting out (or planting into bigger containers), water with a something like a seed weed tonic afterwards. Some gardeners like to soak the pots in a bucket of this tonic before planting out, and some with water afterwards. Both methods work well. This helps with transplant shock.

Remember to put your stakes in early for plants like tomatoes and beans. This avoids the roots being damaged later on.

If you are running short on space - look at ways to grow things vertically. Cucumbers and pumpkins can grow upwards on frames. Lots of plants can also be grown in buckets and grow bags.
