International Schools Competitions

Practice papers for the English exam were issued this week. Children will be asked to complete 2 practice papers per week where possible. We will also meet next week to discuss elements of test technique. Parents please help by ...

- ... keeping a record of scores
- ... advising your child's teacher if a homework workload adjustment is necessary

Remember that these papers are difficult. To get around 20 correct with the first paper is fine, exceeding 30 correct answers is a worthy target, but progress should be celebrated.

Exams are scheduled as follows ... English - 31 July ... Mathematics - 14 August. (amended dates) Practice papers for the maths exam will be made available week beginning 18 June.
