You might be interested ...

As you know, we have taken a slight diversion from conscientiousness toward kindness as our virtue focus for the next month. This coincides with work we are doing with other schools (see our Kahui ako documents sent two weeks back), staff professional development, and class discussions with children. We viewed this video - https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=mTsvSAItPqA - at a recent staff meeting, and thought you might like it too, and that you might like to watch this with your children. It's really about leading out, giving others the benefit of the doubt, practising forgiveness, and respecting others, even when we disagree with them. It's about transcending self, in order to connect in genuine ways with others. We are emphasizing with children the inner joy that we feel when we lift others up, when we put others first, and when we refuse to let our differences divide us.

At a time when people seem so antagonistic toward each other, when people have stopped listening, when differences are emphasised over commonalities, this is a reminder of a much higher calling. The question is always whether we are up to that calling, the way we answer this question has huge implications. We hope you enjoy this.

Cambridge Programme... expressions of interest 2022

If you know of anyone wanting their children to have an exceptional start to secondary school, perhaps suggest that they contact the school to discuss our Cambridge /Senior School Programme, or that they visit our website for more information. Our year 7 and 8 programmes are based on what is arguably the world's best known and respected international curriculum (overseen and continually updated by Cambridge University), we also have an extensive options programme (including extension activities and foreign languages), a science room, teacher to pupil ratios significantly lower than that of urban schools, and much more. Our assessment is that our exiting year 8 students are around 12 months (or more) ahead of their peers on entry to secondary school and this is a massive advantage to them during the secondary settling period.

Some people are paying \$25,000 over 2 years for a Cambridge education ... here it is free. Feel free to ask any secondary school teacher how our graduates cope in their first year at high school, and beyond. A limited number of out of zone places are likely to be available in 2022.

Confirmation of Secondary School

Parents of year 8 children received a form asking for an indication of which secondary school their child is likely to attend in 2022. This helps us to ensure that you get the information you need as we approach information and enrolment time. Please give this some thought and return the form to the classroom teacher.

Finally

The primary objective of our recent library promotion is to hook kids into reading. Please encourage reading at home. The research confirms what sensible people have known all along, that reading makes a huge difference to a child's overall learning experience, it impacts across the curriculum, it introduces kids to ideas and places they have never known before, it introduces us to new ways of thinking about things and, in ways we don't fully understand, it creates and strengthens neural connections. Maybe surprisingly, research seems to indicate that reading text from pages has significant advantages over text on a screen, there is something about holding a book, turning pages etc which makes a difference. So, maybe designate a reading time at home. Show that you are readers too, talk about each other's books, buy books as presents, and maybe turn off the devices. We are constantly restocking our library with new and engaging material, and so please work with your child to tap into this resource, and let us know if your child has a reading interest which is not currently being well met at school. Please let us know where we can help.
