Change of Clothes

Homework

Please do your best to ensure that children complete their homework on designated afternoons, or drop a quick note or email to their teacher if things are getting a bit hectic at home. Most of all we do not want to be chasing homework from children whose circumstances make homework "too big an ask" for them. While we think that

there is benefit from doing homework for most children, we are more than happy to excuse students from homework at a parent's request.

Wellness for school

Remember please ... cough, runny nose, fever, headaches etc ... please keep your child at home and not return them to school for 48 hours after cessation of last symptom. Any doubts please consult your child's GP. Remember to have a care plan in place in case we request pick up from school.

2023 Enrolments

We know this might seem early, but very soon the Board of Trustees will set the number of out of zone enrolments for 2023. Our goal is to keep numbers at, or below, nationally recommended staffing levels. Early information on which children will, or will not, be with us in 2023 is very helpful in achieving optimal class numbers, and also gives us an indication of how many places to advertise for out of zone families. We also receive regular out of zone enquiries, and need to be in a position, very soon, to advise if places are likely

SO ... this message is for those who already know that their children will not be with us, or are unlikely to be with us, in 2023. This message is not for those who are undecided, and need further time due to uncertainty. So, if you DO KNOW that your child WILL NOT, OR VERY LIKELY WILL NOT attend Matarau School in 2023, can you please advise the school office as soon as possible, by phone message over the weekend or on Monday, or drop by to chat with Kevin. Covid protocols for the start of term ... reminder

A huge thank you for coming on board with our commencement protocols - hopefully to be relaxed in the not too distant future. Just to recap ...

- ... Parents are still <u>very welcome</u> on-site to walk their child to their classroom, connect briefly with their child's teacher, call at the office etc. But if you will be on-site for a longer period than this, PLEASE WEAR A MASK, and please call in at the office on arrival, and before departure, to enter your details in our visitor's register. This is a legal site requirement quite apart from covid.
- ... We have a limited number of masks at the school office for parents or children, and so please don't be afraid to ask. If children have forgotten, or misplaced, their masks, they are welcome to call at the office for a replacement. Also, we have a record of those with mask exemptions, and these exemptions will be fully respected. If there is a pressing reason why your child cannot wear a mask, and you have not already advised of this, please leave a message with the school office over the weekend and we will update our records.
- ... So ... Masks are strongly recommended for children years 4 and up when working in enclosed spaces. Masks are optional for children in years 1 to 3. Please also note that masks are required on buses for children aged twelve years or older.
- ... Of even greater importance ... It is ABSOLUTELY CRITICAL that sick children are NOT sent to school. There are no conditions that would warrant this. So, if your child has a cough, a sore throat, head or body aches, fever, breathlessness etc., please keep them home and seek medical advice if necessary. Please keep them at home for a minimum of 48 hours after cessation of final symptoms, or longer on the advice of their doctor ... always err on the side of caution. We suggest that you have a contingency plan in place in the event that your child is unwell, or in the event that the school contacts you with a request that you pick up your child.

Great to be back. Lots planned this term including cross country events, production, gifted education, our unfolding science/technology/enviro schools and even more to follow. Let us know if your child takes a while to settle this term, and if you have questions ask, ask ask!
