Year 7 and 8 Cambridge Programme

Parents of year 6 children will receive some printed information on our year 7 and 8 programme on Monday. This programme provides an exceptional start to secondary school and positions our students for success. Former students consistently tell us how well prepared they were for the demands of secondary school, with many of them transitioning quickly to more advanced learning. Feedback from the secondary schools confirms this.

We will be holding an after school meeting at 3:15 pm in Room 12 on Wednesday 14 September to discuss this programme with you, but we are more than happy to meet with you by appointment.

The Cambridge programme is a **Junior Secondary Level Programme** and so it is demanding. Nevertheless, we can tailor children's programmes to suit their needs and will invite parents to book a meeting mid-way through next term to have input into placement decisions. In the meantime, have a read of the material sent home on Monday, access further material on our website, and let us know if you have questions. We are the only public school in Northland to offer this programme ... and the Board meets the cost.

Calf Club Day Thursday 20 October.

The Closing day for entries is Friday the 9th September.

We are having our yearly Calf Club Day on **Thursday 20th of October** (the first Thursday in Term 4) Because this event is soon after the holidays we need to know the number of children who intend to bring calves, lambs, goats, or a pet (e.g. rabbits, guinea pigs, fish, chicken, etc.). Note that NO DOGS or PUPPIES are permitted and the animal will need to be in cages for the duration of the day.

A booklet needs to be completed if the child is bringing a pet (NOT for calves, lambs, or goats), which will be judged by independent judges & needs to be completed and returned to school <u>by Friday the 22nd of September</u> at the latest to enable booklets to go out for judging.
