Achievement Data

We said last week that we would share some achievement data if space allowed. Recent norm referenced testing (years 4 to 8) indicated ...

- ... 82 % of our students are at or above average in Mathematics
- ... 85% are at our above average in Reading Vocabulary
- ... 83% are at or above average in Reading Comprehension
- ... 80% are at or above average in Listening Comprehension
- ... 73% are at or above average in Punctuation and grammar

These results are based a "normal distribution", meaning quite a wide äverage' band applies to every sample group, but these are still pleasing results. Well done to all concerned - a great team effort!

Sore Throats Matter - Preventing Rheumatic Fever

We have been advised that, with winter on its way, a lot of tamariki are getting sore throats. Sore throats can hurt hearts.

If your tamariki has a sore throat, please get a throat swab from your Practice Nurse at your GP Practice or participating pharmacy.

All children are at risk of developing strep throat however, research has shown that the risk of this leading to Acute Rheumatic Fever is predominantly higher in Maori & Pacific tamariki. Please direct any enquiries to your GP or the Public Health Nurse - Elizabeth Halvorson 021819791
