All started or completed sheets must be returned before the end of term 3.



Calf Club Day - Friday the 13th of October

We are having our yearly Calf Club Day on **Friday 13th of October** (the first Friday in Term 4) Because this event is soon after the holidays we need to know the number of children who intend to bring calves, lambs, or a pet (e.g. rabbits, guinea pigs, fish, chicken, etc.). Note that NO DOGS or PUPPIES are permitted and the animal will need to be in cages for the duration of the day. <u>This year Goats will be judged with the Pets</u>

A booklet needs to be completed if the child is bringing a pet (NOT for calves, lambs), which will be judged by independent judges & needs to be completed and returned to school by

Thursday the 14th of September at the latest to enable booklets to go out for judging.

On our Facebook page this week we pasted a thoughtful comment from a school parent impressed by the manners of a good number of our students. We know that virtues are always a work in progress (for children and adults) but it was very encouraging to get such positive feedback. When we suspended the virtues programme for much of the covid period we did feel there was a drop off. When we picked it up again we noticed a lift. Frequent intentional discussions seem to make a difference.

So, we would like to especially encourage you to spend time discussing honesty with your children over the coming weeks, we will do the same at school. It seems, for reasons that are not entirely clear, that honesty has positive knock on effects with respect to the other virtues. If kids nail this one (and adults I guess) a lot of the other virtues come into line. So please grab the honesty virtue and run with it.
