A bit of data crunching

Our end of year achievement data has shown that approximately 87% of Matarau students are Reading at or above standard, 80 % of students are writing at or above standard, and 77% of students are at or above standard in Mathematics. These are really positive results and are a credit to all involved.

In our focus area of science, our commencement data, taken mid-2022, showed 57% of students at or above standard in Science capabilities. There has been significant work done during 2022/23 in science, using the science boxes, STEAM, and in ownership with STEAM as a context. Data shows that across all levels (years 3-8) there has been a significant shift of students now working at or above in science capabilities. Our end of 2023 data shows 90.7% of students are now working at and above, which has far exceeded our targets. We thank Mr Johnson for leading us in this area and all the staff and students who have worked hard toward this result. This really is something to celebrate!

Farewell staff...

You have seen a list of our 2024 staffing. There is a name that has been on the list for a very long time that we are sad to farewell. Mrs Julie Williams has been a part of our school for 18 years in a number of roles; parent, classroom teacher and more recently as our Learning Support and pastoral care teacher. Julie has been so dedicated in this role and many of our students have benefited from her dedication and expertise. We are very grateful to have had her as a colleague, friend and mentor. We wish Julie all the best for her future endeavors and will miss her dearly.

Caitlyn Redwood has been with us as a teacher Aide for the past three terms. We have enjoyed connecting with you again Caitlyn and thank you for your work in Room 1. We wish you all the best for your Teacher training next year.

Mrs Jenny Wiegersma has been teaching in Room 1a and will return to us later in 2024. Thank you for your dedication in this role and we look forward to your return.
