Matarau School Honours Environmental Education

Over the term, Matarau School has embraced environmental education by inviting local environmental experts to share their knowledge with all students. These sessions have provided valuable insights into sustainability and the role we all play as Kaitiaki of our environment.

Our first guest speaker was Lucretia from ECO Solutions, who focused on waste management. Students explored the key principles of refusing, reducing, reusing, recycling, and rotting. They examined a variety of containers, boxes, and food packaging, learning how to identify recycling symbols and determine which items could be repurposed or had to go into waste. The discussions were rich and thought provoking, with students sharing their own experiences and sustainable practices at home.



Next, Anna Talbot from the Northland Regional Council (NRC) spoke to students about natural hazards, explaining how different environmental factors impact our region and the importance of being prepared.






Our third session featured the Biosecurity Team from NRC, who educated students on pests in our environment. They highlighted how invasive species—sometimes unexpected ones like koi carp fish and deer—are taking over habitats and threatening native ecosystems. Students gained a deeper understanding of biosecurity and the importance of pest control in protecting our natural environment.

These expert-led sessions have enriched our students' learning, providing them with explicit teaching around sustainability. Back in the classroom, they had the opportunity to extend their knowledge through various areas of the curriculum, reinforcing their role as guardians of the environment.

Matarau School is proud to be on a journey toward excellence in environmental education. It is inspiring to see our students' leadership, knowledge, and passion driving us toward a more sustainable future.
