Property Projects Update

There's been a lot happening around the school recently to enhance our environment for learning and accessibility:

<u>Wheelchair Access Ramp</u>: The ramp upgrade is progressing well. This will provide improved access to key areas of the school for all learners.





School Wash and Painting: The entire school has now had a professional power wash. Over the next few weeks, we'll begin a round of painting to freshen up the site and ensure our kura continues to be a place we can all feel proud of.

Field Drainage Improvements: We are actively working on improving the school's drainage systems, particularly around the field. Too often, our field is out of action during the wetter months, limiting opportunities for outdoor play and sport. Unfortunately, the shelter belt of trees has significantly contributed to poor drainage. We are now exploring options to address this long-term issue.

PB4L – Positive Behaviour for Learning

We're excited to share that Matarau School is joining the PB4L (Positive Behaviour for Learning) programme. This is a Ministry of Education initiative that supports schools to create positive, supportive environments where learning can thrive. This framework helps schools to:

- Develop consistent expectations for behaviour
- Recognise and reinforce positive choices
- Develop their physical environment to help enhance learning

Coming Up – Before & After School Care Consultation






If things are a bit tight for you at the moment, please let us know ... there a number of things we can do to lighten the burden of school-associated costs.

A coreboard in a school is a visual communication tool designed to support non-verbal or minimally verbal students, often used as part of an AAC (Augmentative and Alternative Communication) approach. It typically features a grid of symbols or words representing key vocabulary – often called core vocabulary – that learners can point to in order to express themselves.

PMP - Room 1 & 2

The Perceptual Motor Programme (PMP) is a movement-based initiative widely implemented in New Zealand primary schools, particularly for children in their first two years of schooling (Years 0–2). The programme focuses on developing foundational motor skills and perceptual abilities that are crucial for early learning.



















Te Manawa Tahi is a learning support hub where you can talk to educational professionals about your child's learning needs. This is a free service.

If you have a concern about your child's language development, learning progress, social and emotional well-being or behaviour, Te Manawa Tahi have specialists available so you can discuss your concerns directly with them.
